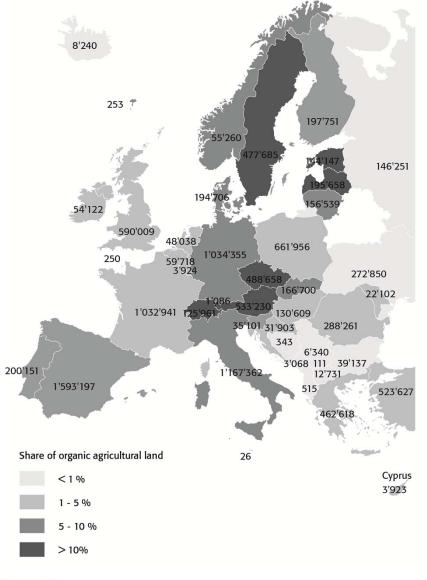

Organic agriculture in Europe: Key data/indicators 2012

- > 11.2 million hectares of agricultural land are organic (including in conversion areas).
- This constitutes 2.3 percent of the agricultural land in Europe.
- The organic agricultural land increased by 0.63 million hectares or six percent in 2012.
- > Amost 320'000 producers were reported.





Organic agriculture in the European Union: Key data/indicators 2012

- 10 million hectares of agricultural land are organic (including in conversion areas).
- This constitutes 5.6 percent of the agricultural land in the European Union.
- The organic agricultural land increased by 0.54 million hectares or six percent in 2012.
- > Almost 250'000 producers were reported.





Organic market in Europe: Key data/indicators 2012

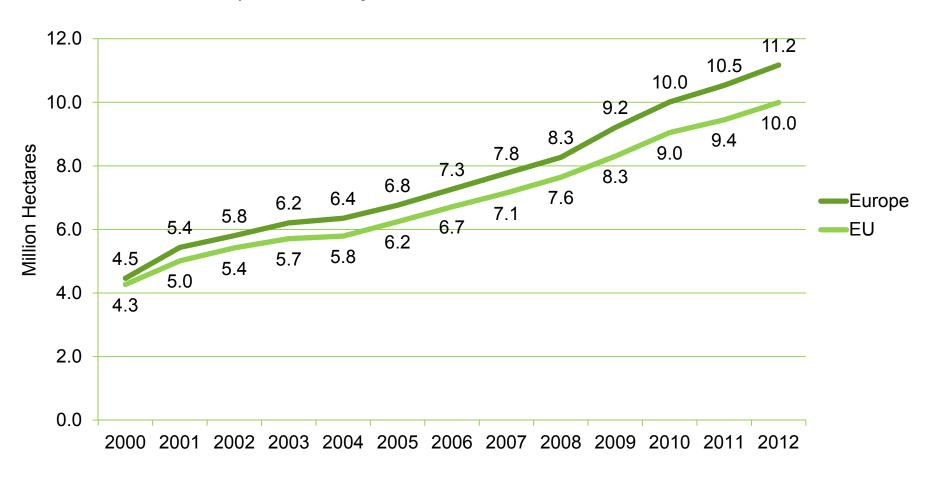
- The market was 22.8 billion euros; six percent more than in 2011.
- The largest market for organic products in 2012 was Germany with a turnover of 7 billion euros, followed by France (4 billion euros) and the UK (1'950 million euros).
- As a portion of the total market share, the highest levels have been reached in Denmark, Austria and Switzerland, with six percent or more for organic products. The highest per capita spending is also in these countries and in Luxembourg.

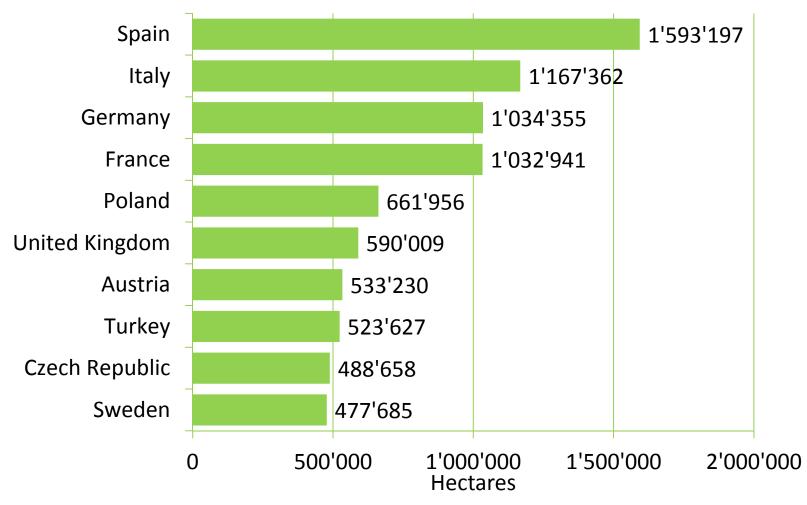






Europe: The ten countries with the largest organic area 2012

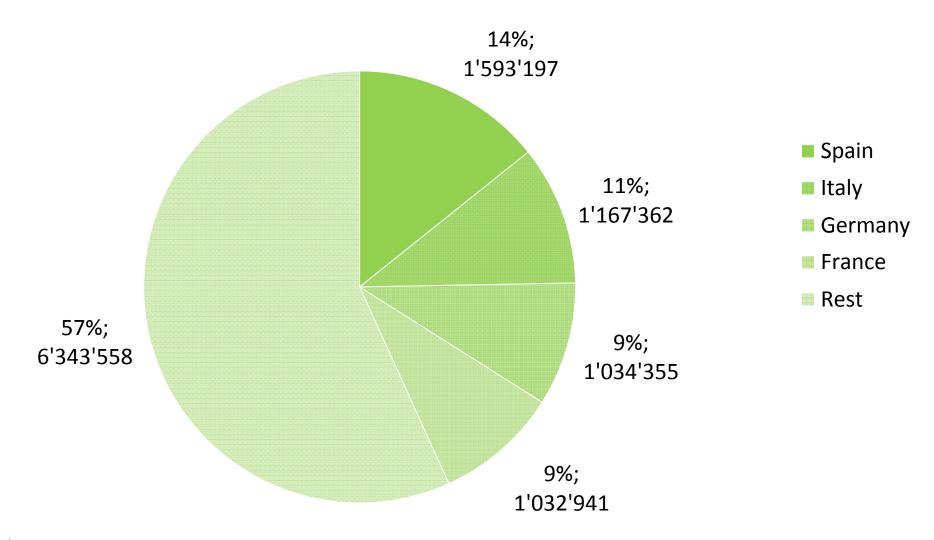






Europe: Distribution of organically managed agricultural land by country 2012 (Total: 11.2 million hectares)

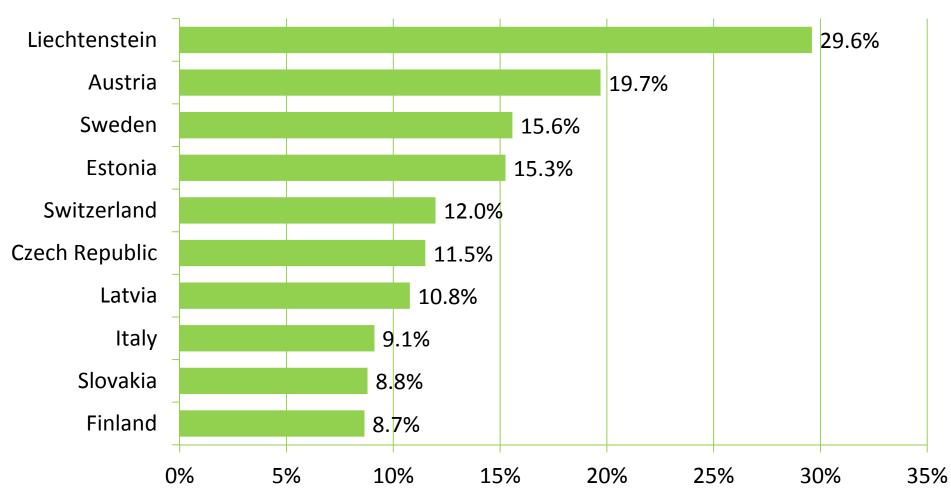






Europe: The countries with the highest share of organic agricultural land 2012

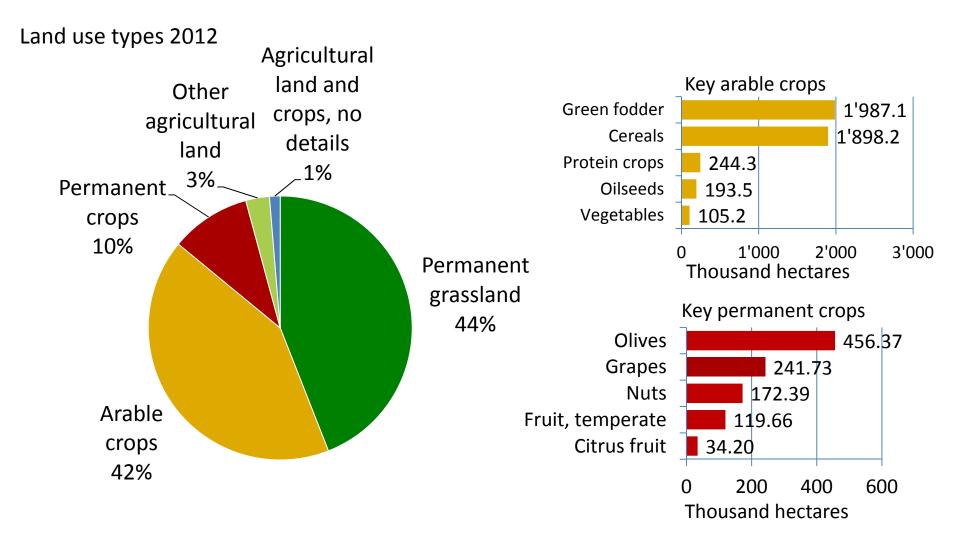






Europe: Use of agricultural organic land 2012

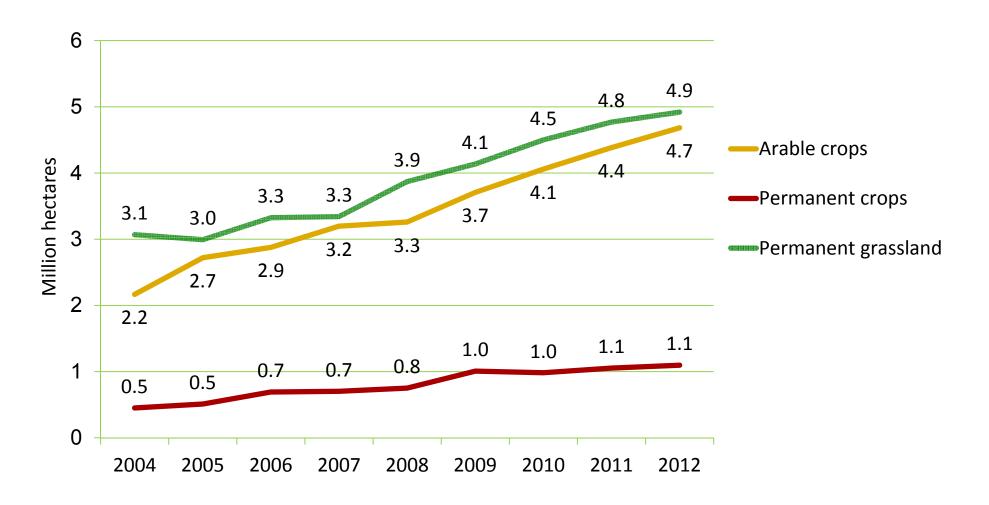






Development of the organic land by land use type 2004-2012

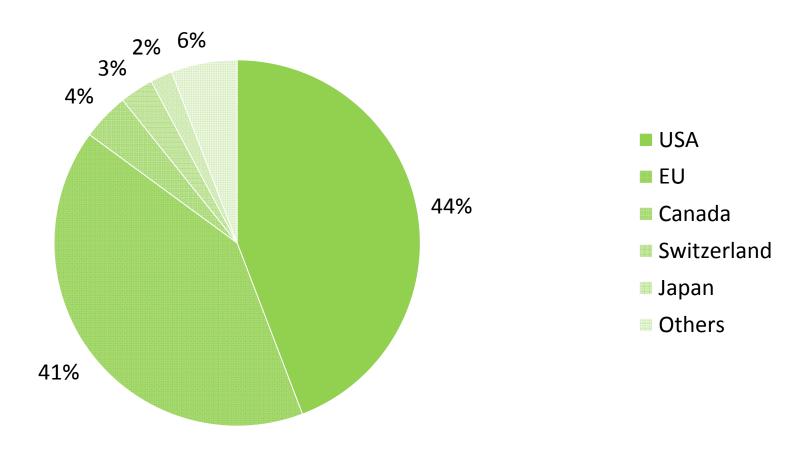






Global market: Distribution of retail sales value by single markets 2012

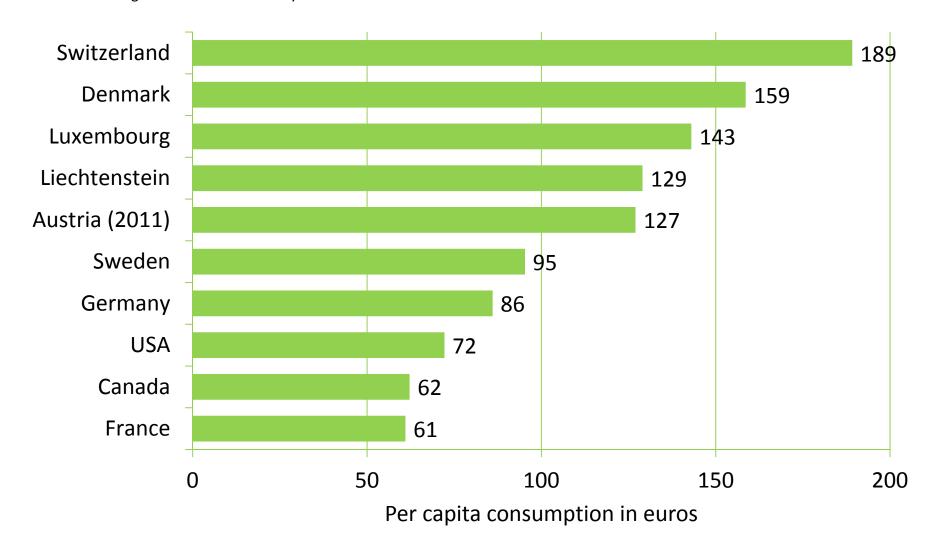






The ten countries with the highest per capita consumption 2012

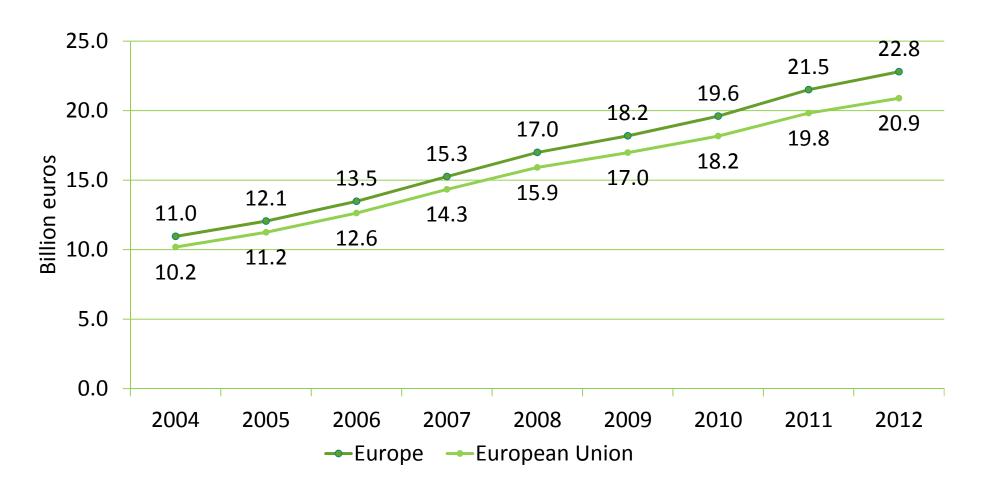






Europe and European Union: Market development 2004-2012

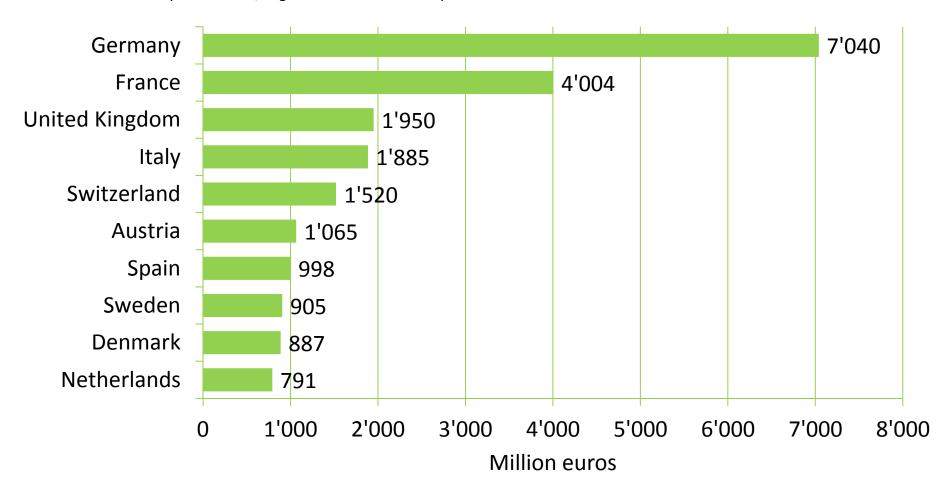






The European market for organic food and drink: The countries with the highest sales 2012

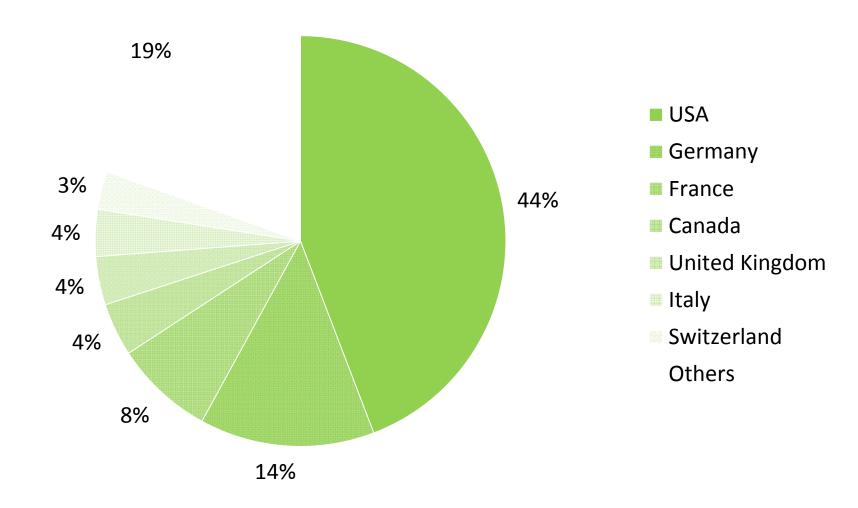






Global market: Distribution of retail sales value by country

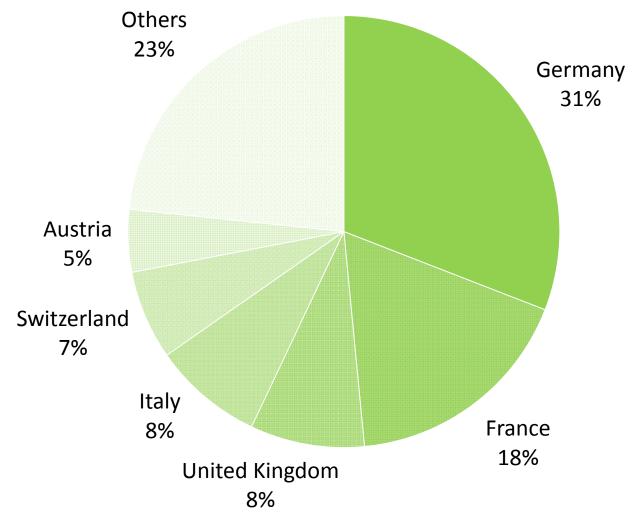






Europe: Distribution of sales of organic food and drink by country 2012 (total: 22.8 billion euros)

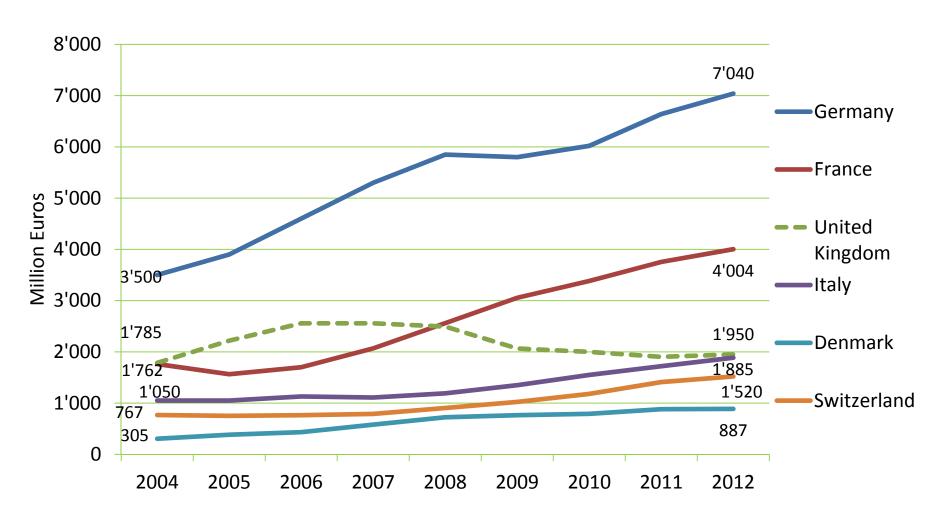






Development of the Organic Market in Selected European Countries 2004-2012

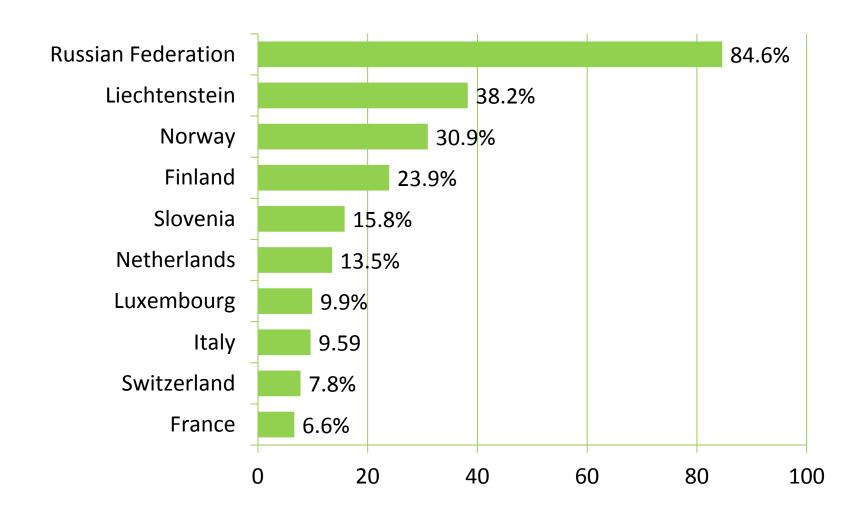






Europe: The ten countries with the highest market growth 2012
